Equipment Lists and Resources

Emergency Operations Centre

The Emergency Operations Centre (EOC) location is dependent on the location and magnitude of the spill.

The EOC could be established:

- close by the spill site;
- within Taranaki Regional Council's office at 47 Cloten Road, Stratford; or
- at the Taranaki Emergency Management Office (TEMO), Robe Street, New Plymouth. TEMO can be activated through Taranaki Regional Council Emergency Management Officers: 06-7581110 or 0800 900 049.

The Taranaki Regional Council's office and the Emergency Management Office have the following equipment for spill response:

For smaller spills the EOC may be set up at an alternative location at the discretion of the ROSC. In significant spills the most probable site would be the **Taranaki Emergency Management Office**. A floor plan for the EOC set up in the building is on the next page.

In selecting a suitable alternative site, availability of the following should be considered:

- radio communications and operators to cover the communications plan;
- telephone and fax communications to allow communication with the Council's Chief Executive; supporting organisations; adjacent regional authorities (if appropriate); regional suppliers and contractors; advisory groups; affected parties; media; etc;
- suitable facilities and resources (e.g. display boards) to display incident information; and
- access to relief EOC and field staff.

The Council has a digital wireless key telephone system held in the Inspectorate Offices that can be set up almost anywhere.

It should be noted that in some areas in the region cell-phone coverage is not available.

The EOC need not be adjacent to the spill site, although this may give the developers of the Action Plan a first hand appreciation of the situation and enhance communication with operators at the spill site.

Equipment Lists and Mobilisation Instructions

The ROSC may mobilise material and personnel in support of an oil spill response operation. This Annex deals with the equipment located in the district and where it is stored. Personnel details are dealt with in Annex 2.

In order for Taranaki to respond to a spill, Maritime New Zealand (MNZ) has located specific equipment in the region for this purpose. This equipment is effectively on loan to the region and is subject to conditions for storage, maintenance and use. A copy of the loan agreement can be found in Council's document management system.

The equipment is stored at a Port Taranaki Limited storage building (in the old Power Station site), within the Port boundaries, at the end of Breakwater Road, New Plymouth, and is only used for oil spill response. Should any organisation approach the Council with a view of using the equipment for a purpose other than oil spill response, this will first need the agreement of MNZ and be subject to commercial hire rates.

The list below sets out equipment owned by MNZ, but located in the region. **After hours access to equipment will need to be arranged by contacting Port Taranaki Limited staff at Port Taranaki which is manned on a 24 hour basis, the contact number is 06 751 0200, or by contacting personnel at the Taranaki Regional Council on 06 765 7127 (Rik Caskey, Bruce Pope or Flo Blyde).**

Transport of equipment stored at Port Taranaki can be arranged through Port Taranaki or Hookers Pacific, New Plymouth (06-755 9990 or After hours 027 442 4900).

Additionally, the ROSC may request that some/all of the national resources of MNZ be mobilised to support a Tier II operation. These requests should be directed to the Oil Spill Duty Officer, MNZ. Details of the MNZ equipment are listed in the sheet at the end of this annex. In addition there is a significant amount of equipment available at various private organisations and companies in the region available in the event of a spill.

Inventory of NZ Marine Oil Pollution Equipment and Locations

Data that is routinely updated by Maritime New Zealand (MNZ) can be found in the National Marine Oil Spill Contingency Plan at the end of Annex 1, or on WEBEOC.

Storage, maintenance and hire of Maritime New Zealand equipment

Excerpts from the contract between MNZ and the Taranaki Regional Council are shown below:

Responsibilities of Maritime New Zealand

Maritime New Zealand will:

- Refund the Council the actual and reasonable costs of storing and maintaining the equipment positioned in the Taranaki region
- Bear the cost of delivery and return of the equipment
- Loan the equipment for an indefinite period from 14 October 1993.

Responsibilities of the Taranaki Regional Council

The Council will:

- Take delivery of the designated equipment at a mutually agreed place. At the end of the period of loan will return it to MNZ at the same place.
- Prepare a Health and Safety Plan for the use of this equipment. In particular this plan will identify:
 - Any training or supervision required before personnel may use the equipment;
 - Any hazards the equipment may present, and steps to eliminate, isolate and minimise those hazards; and
 - Any personal protective equipment (e.g. hearing and eye protection) that must be worn when the equipment is in operation.
- Make the equipment immediately available for use or re-deployment by MNZ in an emergency or otherwise anywhere in New Zealand or overseas, at the request of MNZ.
- Assist, if requested by MNZ, in the emergency re-deployment of the equipment anywhere in New Zealand by advising and/or procuring transport arrangements at the MNZ's expense.
- Except when deployed for actual or simulated oil spills, store the equipment at all times in a secure, clean and dry storage area enclosed from the weather and free of vermin.
- Recover from the polluter the cost for the equipment's use in a marine clean-up response. The rates to be charged of the polluter are those established by the MNZ for the hire of the equipment.
- Obtain the prior permission of MNZ for the use of the equipment for purposes other than marine clean-up response or for the training purposes of the Taranaki region. If approval of MNZ is given then the Council shall ensure that a Hire Agreement supplied by MNZ is signed and complied with by the equipment's user, and that monies accrued from such hire is credited to MNZ. Additionally, the Taranaki Regional Council is to ensure that the equipment is returned in the same condition as it was hired out, that remedial repairs are made at the expense of the user, and shall inform the owner of any damage or deterioration incurred.
- Keep MNZ informed of the equipment's serviceability, location and how it may be immediately obtained.
- Keep the equipment, during the period of the loan, in good and substantial repair and condition (fair wear and tear excepted) in accordance with the maintenance schedules provided by MNZ. In doing this, the Council is to ensure that repairs retain the structural identity and performance of the equipment; are undertaken by a contractor approved by MNZ; and that MNZ be consulted before repairs exceeding \$500.00 are undertaken.
- Indemnify and keep indemnified MNZ from and against all actions, claims, proceedings, demands, losses, expenses and costs of every kind whatsoever which may be brought against or upon MNZ or which it may incur, sustain or be put to by reason of or arising out of or in any way attributable directly or indirectly to the loan of the equipment and its use by the Council, or any third party.
- Operate the equipment only under the supervision of person(s) trained in its use by MNZ, in accordance with the operating procedures forwarded with the equipment, and in accordance with any supplementary instructions given by MNZ. The Council will ensure that any third party operates the equipment in accordance with procedures forwarded with the equipment and any supplementary instructions given by MNZ.

Insurance

The equipment is insured by MNZ except when hired by a third party who shall take out insurance as part of the Hire Agreement. The Council will not be liable for damage to the equipment except where such damages were caused by wilful misconduct or gross

negligence on the part of the Council, or where such damages results from a breach of this Agreement by the Council.

Breach of Agreement

If the Council breaches this Agreement, and as a result of such a breach the equipment is damaged or lost, the Council may be liable to MNZ for the damage or loss. Such liability may include the total cost of repairing or replacing the equipment to MNZ's specification.

There shall be no assignment under this Agreement without the consent of MNZ.

Termination

The Agreement for the loan of MNZ equipment to the Council may be terminated by either party during the period of the loan by giving not less than one week's notice in writing to the other. Whenever this agreement is so terminated the Council will allow MNZ to retrieve the equipment from the place where delivery was taken, or at some mutually agreed place.

Wildlife equipment and resources

One container of specialist equipment (blue box) is held with the MNZ marine oil spill response equipment in the old Power Station site, within the Port boundaries, at the end of Breakwater Road, New Plymouth and can only be used in a response. The contents of this container are designed to cater for the first 24–48 hours of a wildlife response including the capture of up to 50 oiled birds. A contents list for this container can be found at the back of this annex. Access to the building can be obtained by going to the Port Taranaki Ltd Security Gate at the Port, or by contacting personnel at the Taranaki Regional Council on 06 765 7127 (Rik Caskey, Bruce Pope or Flo Blyde).

A trailer of additional wildlife equipment is also available from Massey University, Palmerston North and can be accessed via the Oiled Wildlife Response Emergency Duty Phone: 027 246 2267. A contents list for this trailer can be found at the back of this annex.

Emergency treatment and rehabilitation centres

Sites for appropriate emergency treatment and rehabilitation centres for wildlife affected by oil spills have been identified as:

- New Plymouth District Council (Hobson Street) Works Depot on Hobson Street, New Plymouth; or
- Hawera A & P Showgrounds, Burnside Ave, Hawera; or
- Ballance Fertiliser Store, Main Road, Opunake, Taranaki.

Further information and contacts for these sites can be found at the back of this annex.

Letters of consent have been obtained from the New Plymouth District Council and Hawera A&P Association; however contact will still need to be made to use the sites. No letter of consent has been obtained from Ballance, however there should be no difficulty using the site if appropriate contact is made prior to use.

Other suitable sites may be identified on a case by case basis.

Equipment

The following equipment is available in the Taranaki region:

Personnel equipment

- Overalls, wet weather gear, rubber gloves, waders, goggles, safety glasses. From: TRC, contact the Maintenance Officer, 06-765 7127; or NZ Safety Ltd.
- Wildlife container – A list of the contents is at the back of this annex.

Wildlife capture equipment

- Wax lined cardboard boxes for bird transport are in the wildlife container held at the Port Taranaki Storage Building.

Other equipment

- 2 dog traps (ideal for large birds or seals), Stratford District Council
- 2 cat size nets: SPCA – New Plymouth
- 1 cat size net: SPCA – South Taranaki/Hawera
- 3 (more can be obtained) cat traps (ideal for small birds) – Taranaki Regional Council Environment Services Section.

Bird hazing equipment

- bird scarers: Taranaki Fish and Game Council
- Other 'items' that could be used: flash tape, balloons, shooting clubs, farmers in vicinity (Environment Services section of Taranaki Regional Council could also be of assistance).

Hot water supplies

- Fonterra Co-operative Group Ltd Whareroa, unlimited very clean hot water at approx 60-65° C, tankers may be available for transport outside milking season.
- Transpacific Industrial Solution (formerly Onyx) can provide tankers for transport of hot water

Miscellaneous items that could be obtained from around the region

- Boats, rubber matting, plastic lining for wastes oil sinks, plumbing supplies, cage building supplies, suitable supply of wildlife foodstuffs (particularly fish).

Disposal of Waste Oil

The waste oil from cleaning the oiled wildlife will be collected into containers or covered pits to be dug as needed, subject to TRC's Technical Services advice/input, and lined with plastic. This waste oil will be collected and disposed of by a combination of the following:

- Intergroup (formerly Transpacific Industrial Solutions);
- Beach Energy Ltd – Waihapa Production Station;
- Greymouth Petroleum - Kaimiro Production Station;
- Port Taranaki de-ballast facility (currently closed but could be recommissioned).

The responsibility for disposal of oily wastes rests with the Operations team. Information is available from the Planning team at the ICC.

MNZ has an arrangement with Envirowaste to provide nationwide waste management services during either a Tier 2 or Tier 3 oil spill response. 24 hour contact details for Envirowaste are: Des McLeary, Ph 0274 874 946 or Wayne Plummer, Ph 012 966 488.

Temporary Storage

Potential sites for temporary waste storage are at the Port Taranaki yard areas and the old oil company installations on Centennial Drive, Ngamotu Road, and Breakwater Road in New Plymouth.

Potential containers for temporary waste storage are the MNZ flexi dam, drums, various Port Taranaki containers and sucker trucks.

Disposal Options

The Colson Road Landfill in New Plymouth is no longer accepting such wastes. Therefore waste will need to be transported outside of the region.

MNZ has a contract with Envirowaste and they can be contacted as above.

Sucker trucks

Various sucker trucks can be obtained from Intergroup (see information earlier in this annex).

Oiled Equipment

Port Taranaki have yard areas, separators and steam cleaning equipment suitable for cleaning oiled equipment.

The old oil company installations on Centennial Drive, Ngamotu Road, and Breakwater Road in New Plymouth, have containment areas and separators which also could be suitable.

Other sites that could be considered for cleaning oiled equipment include production station sites in the region such as Oaonui, Pohokura or Kupe.

A number of hire companies in Taranaki have steam cleaning equipment which could be utilised to clean oiled equipment.

Recovery and disposal of oily wastes

The Science Services advisor will identify suitable land sites when required by ROSC for the reception and disposal of oiled debris and liaise with the appropriate authorities to obtain their approval. These sites may be temporary or permanent sites.

Hazardous material

Other hazardous material will be treated on a case by case basis and the avenues for disposal known to the Science Services advisor will be used. Safety in relation to the use of breathing apparatus and appropriate clothing will be considered at all times. Guidance from the Taranaki Hazardous Substances Technical Liaison Committee can be sought by calling the New Plymouth Police Station on 06-757 5449.
