Terms and Conditions for funding applications to the Taranaki Biodiversity Trust 2016

The Trust will consider projects which support the ecological priorities outlined in Section 5 of the Taranaki Biodiversity Forum Accord:

1. Secure populations of Threatened, At-risk or Regionally distinctive species (see page 8)
2. Protect habitat of Threatened, At risk or Regionally distinctive species
3. Maintain the extent of rare and threatened ecosystems and environments (see page 7) and projects which
4. Support Kaitiakitanga to help restore the health of Papatuanuku
5. Value nature i.e. environmental education and advocacy

Applications will not be considered for:

- Wetlands identified as Regionally Significant by the Taranaki Regional Council (TRC) as funding is available via the Environmental Enhancement Grant at TRC for their protection
- Key Native Ecosystems within the first five years of their Biodiversity Plan as funding is available via Taranaki Regional Council for their management.
- Riparian planting
- Work required under Resource Consent
- Operational costs, including salary and wages

Only one application per group/organization or private landowner can be made to the Trust each financial year.

- The Trust will contribute a maximum of 50% of the total cost of a project. The total cost includes cash, and the dollar value of any 'in kind' contributions from the applicant i.e. time/labour of staff and volunteers.
- The minimum amount which can be applied for is \$1,000, and the maximum amount is \$10,000.

Applications

1. A Taranaki Biodiversity Trust (the Trust) application form must be completed and submitted, following discussion with the Trust Co-ordinator or one of the Trustees.
2. Additional information i.e. photographs, maps, drawings/plans, should be provided to support the application.
3. Applications are considered at a meeting of the Trust. All applications are considered individually, and on

their own merit. The Trustees retain the right to grant funds in greater or lesser amounts.

4. The Trust encourages funding applications from community groups, organisations and private landowners undertaking work on land under formal protection.
5. Any funds provided by the Trust are for the specific purpose outlined in the applicant's funding application, and the confirmation letter. The Trust retains the right to withhold funds, in part or full, if the grant has been used for purposes NOT approved.
6. Grants will only be paid to the applicant.
7. Funds are to be uplifted within one (1) year of approval unless approved by the Trust. Applicants must apply for an extension three months prior to expiry. Where funds are not uplifted in part or full within one (1) year, the Trust retains the right to return any/all funds to the Trust's Application Fund.
8. Payment is made after all work outlined in the funding application has been completed, and a claim form including proof of expenditure and photographs of the work is approved by the Trust Co-ordinator.
9. The applicant is required to provide copies of invoices charged directly to the applicant for costs associated with the approved funding application. The Trust's grant is provided as a rebate to the applicant after the work has been completed. The Trust is not obliged to settle any creditor account charged directly to the Trust without prior approval from the Trust to the applicant.
10. The applicant agrees to notify the Trust in writing should the grant not be required, or the project does not proceed.

Communication

1. The applicant agrees to acknowledge the support of the Trust in publicity material prepared in relation to the project.
2. The applicant agrees for their name and images of their project to be used in publicity material of the Trust.

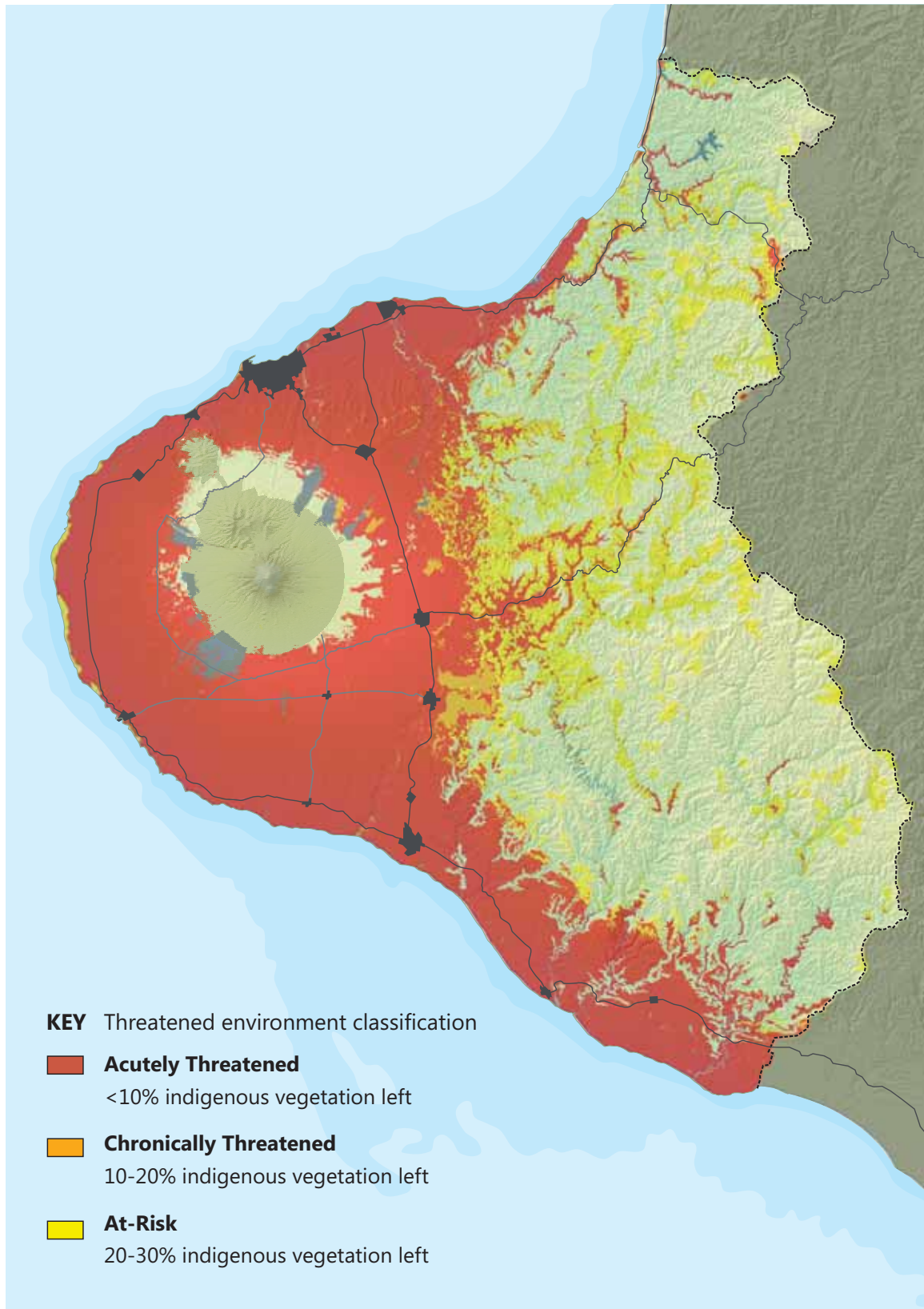

- Raise funds to support this work



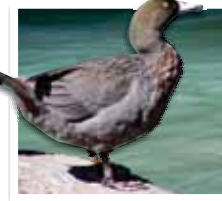
