
At this time of the year we always set the scene for the year to come and we're really excited about where we're heading. Read on







Look into wetlands as a key carbon sink. This includes field visits to manmade and natural wetlands; science based investigations with key projects

Interested in systems? This can be anything from the Principles of Permaculture through to looking at alternative forms of energy.


Designing and building a tiny home, a terrarium, a bird-house or bug hotel fits in here. Very hands-on!
