

Purpose

1. The purpose of this memorandum is to advise the Council of consents granted, consents under application and of consent processing actions since the last meeting. This information is summarised in attachments at the end of this report.

Executive summary

2. Memorandum to advise the Council of recent consenting actions made under regional plans and the Resource Management Act 1991, in accordance with Council procedures and delegations.

Recommendation

That the Taranaki Regional Council:

a) <u>receives</u> the schedule of resource consents granted and other consent processing actions, made under delegated authority.

Background

3. The attachments show resource consent applications, certificates of compliance and deemed permitted activities that have been investigated and decisions made by officers of the Taranaki Regional Council. They are activities having less than minor adverse effects on the environment, or having minor effects where affected parties have agreed to the activity. In accordance with sections 87BB, 104 to 108 and 139 of the Resource Management Act 1991, and pursuant to delegated authority to make these decisions, the Chief Executive or the Director – Resource Management has allowed the consents, certificates of compliance and deemed permitted activities.

- 4. The exercise of delegations under the Resource Management Act 1991 is reported for Members' information. Under the delegations manual, consent processing actions are to be reported to the Consents and Regulatory Committee.
- 5. In addition to the details of the activity consented, the information provided identifies the Iwi whose rohe (area of interest) the activity is in. If the activity is in an area of overlapping rohe both Iwi are shown. If the activity is within, adjacent to, or directly affecting a statutory acknowledgement (area of special interest), arising from a Treaty settlement process with the Crown, that is also noted.
- 6. Also shown, at the request of Iwi members of the Council, is a summary of the engagement with Iwi and Hapū, undertaken by the applicant and the Council during the application process. Other engagement with third parties to the consent process is also shown. The summary shows the highest level of involvement that occurred with each party. For example, a party may have been consulted by the applicant, provided with a copy of the application by the Council, served notice as an affected party, lodged a submission and ultimately agreed with the consent conditions. In that case the summary would show only 'agreed with consent conditions', otherwise reporting becomes very complicated.
- 7. The attachment titled 'Consent Processing Information' includes the figure 'Consent Applications in Progress' which shows the total number of applications in the consent processing system over the last twelve months. The number of applications for the renewal of resource consents is also shown. The difference between the two is the number of new applications, including applications for a change of consent conditions. New applications take priority over renewal applications. Renewal applications are generally put on hold, with the agreement of the applicant, and processed when staff resources allow. A consent holder can continue to operate under a consent that is subject to renewal. The above approach is pragmatic and ensures there are no regulatory impediments to new activities requiring authorisation.
- 8. The attachment also includes:
 - Applications in progress table the number of applications in progress at the end of each month (broken down into total applications and the number of renewals in progress) for this year and the previous two years
 - Potential hearings table outlining the status of applications where a hearing is anticipated and the decision maker(s) (e.g. a hearing panel) has been appointed
 - Consents issued table the number of consents issued at the end of each month for this year and the previous two years
 - Breakdown of consents issued. This is the number of consents issued broken down by purpose new, renewals, changes or review
 - Types of consents issued, further broken down into notification types nonnotified, limited notified or public notified
 - Number of times that the public and iwi were involved in an application process for the year so far
 - Application processing time extensions compared to the previous years
 - Consent type process shows the notification type including applications submitted on and the pre-hearing resolution numbers
 - Applications that have been returned because they are incomplete

Decision-making considerations

9. Part 6 (Planning, decision-making and accountability) of the *Local Government Act* 2002 has been considered and documented in the preparation of this agenda item. The recommendations made in this item comply with the decision-making obligations of the *Act*.

Financial considerations—LTP/Annual Plan

10. This memorandum and the associated recommendations are consistent with the Council's adopted Long-Term Plan and estimates. Any financial information included in this memorandum has been prepared in accordance with generally accepted accounting practice.

Policy considerations

11. This memorandum and the associated recommendations are consistent with the policy documents and positions adopted by this Council under various legislative frameworks including, but not restricted to, the *Local Government Act 2002*, the *Resource Management Act 1991* and the *Local Government Official Information and Meetings Act 1987*.

lwi considerations

12. This memorandum and the associated recommendations are consistent with the Council's policy for the development of Māori capacity to contribute to decision-making processes (schedule 10 of the *Local Government Act 2002*) as outlined in the adopted long-term plan and/or annual plan. Similarly, iwi involvement in adopted work programmes has been recognised in the preparation of this memorandum.

Legal considerations

13. This memorandum and the associated recommendations comply with the appropriate statutory requirements imposed upon the Council.

Response to Iwi comments

A response was sent to Ngāruahine thanking them for their comment and outlined the limitations on matters for discretion when processing an application for a controlled activity. Further, that TRC has confirmed a definite deadline to the discharge of dairy effluent to water of Dec 1 2022 whereby the applicant must upgrade their system so that it discharges to land only.

Do not oppose the use of water pumped from the installation of the underpass for livestock. Te Korowai would like and granted permit to be timebound i.e., not granted in perpetuity. To this end we suggest a period of three years is sufficient to meet the requirements of the applicant.

As previously mentioned, Ngāruahine provided comment to the Council on 24 November 2021. Initially, the proposal did not contravene values however requested a three year duration as oppose to the common catchment expiry date.

Further to the comments provided by Ngāruahine, a section 92 request for further information was sent to the applicant on 25 November 2021 which requested the applicant provide an assessment of effects on tāngata whenua values as one had not been received upon submission. Subsequently, the applicant engaged directly with the Pou Taiao from Ngāruahine seeking guidance with respect to the proposal and a mutual decision was made that a 10 year duration period would be suitable in this instance as effects on surface waterbodies were less than minor and therefore would not contravene values. Consent duration is discussed further towards the end of this report.





Purpose

1. The purpose of this memorandum is to advise the Council of 14 tailored compliance monitoring reports that have been prepared since the last meeting.

Executive summary

- 2. The Council considers the regular reporting of comprehensive and well-considered compliance monitoring is vital to undergird:
 - Community standing and reputation enhancement for companies that consistently attain good or high levels of environmental performance. Informed feedback is appropriate and valuable, and assists a proactive alignment of industry's interests with community and Resource Management Act 1991 expectations.
 - A respectful and responsible regard for the Taranaki region's environment and our management of its natural resources. Reporting allows evaluation and demonstration of the overall rate of compliance by sector and by consent holders as a whole, and of trends in the improvement of our environment.
 - The Council's accountability and transparency. Reporting gives validity to investment in monitoring and to assessments of effective intervention.
- 3. These Council reports have been submitted to the consent holder for comment and confirmation of accuracy prior to publication. All reports provide environmental performance and administrative compliance ratings for each consent holder in relation to their activities over the period being reported, and provide recommendations for the following monitoring year.
- 4. There are 14 tailored compliance monitoring reports. Within the reports, overall environmental ratings assigned included 13 high, 2 good, and 2 improvement required (Table 1).

- 5. For reference, in the 2020-2021 year, consent holders were found to achieve a high level of environmental performance and compliance for 835 (86%) of a total of 971 consents monitored through the Taranaki tailored monitoring programmes, while for another 105 (11%) of the consents a good level of environmental performance and compliance was achieved. A further 26 (2.5%) of consents monitored required improvement in their performance, while the remaining 5 (0.5%) achieved a rating of poor (Table 2).

- 6. 21-11 DH Lepper Trust (Piggery) Monitoring Programme Annual Report 2020-2021

- 8. DH Lepper Trust (the Company) operates a "farrow to finish" piggery breeding and fattening unit located on 541 Mountain Road Lepperton, in the Waiongana catchment. The facility includes a solids composting process and an anaerobic biogas digester that generates about half of the total electricity usage for the site. Effluent from the piggery is now largely irrigated to land, a recent innovation in effluent management on the site.
- 9. During the monitoring period, DH Lepper Trust (Piggery) demonstrated a high level of environmental and administrative performance.
- 10. The Company holds two resource consents, which include a total of 34 conditions setting out the requirements that the Company must satisfy. Resource consent 0715-4.1 allows the discharge of treated effluent to land and the Waiongana Stream, and consent 5206-2.1 allows for the discharge of piggery related emissions to air at this site.
- 11. The Council's monitoring programme for the year under review included three inspections, and the collection of wastewater and receiving water samples for physicochemical analysis.
- 12. The monitoring showed that the wastewater and receiving water samples were well within the consented limits and the discharge has little, if any effect on the Waiongana Stream and surrounding environment. As in previous years. There were no unauthorised incidents recording non-compliance in respect of this consent holder during the period under review.
- 13. In terms of overall environmental and compliance performance by the consent holder over the last several years, this report shows that the consent holder's performance remains at a high level in the year under review.
- 14. Recommendations:
 - 14.1. THAT in the first instance, monitoring of consented activities at D H Lepper Trust Piggery in the 2021-2022 year continue at the same level as in 2020-2021 period.
 - 14.2. THAT should there be issues with environmental or administrative performance in 2021-2022, monitoring may be adjusted to reflect any additional investigation or intervention as found necessary.

21-12 STDC Water Supplies Monitoring Programme Annual Report 2020-2021

- 15. The South Taranaki District Council (STDC) operates a total of 11 water treatment plants (WTPs) throughout the district.
- 16. During the monitoring period, STDC demonstrated a high level of environmental and administrative performance.
- 17. STDC holds 33 resource consents, which include 307 conditions setting out the requirements that must be satisfied. STDC holds 15 consents to take water, ten consents to discharge to both land and water, and eight consents to construct and maintain instream structures.

- 18. During the 2020-2021 monitoring period the Council's monitoring programme included ten inspections, the collection of eight water samples for physicochemical analysis, four biomonitoring surveys of receiving water, and one fish survey. Abstraction, stream flow and discharge data, provided by the consent holder, was analysed and reviewed.
- 19. Chemical sampling of discharges and receiving waters and macroinvertebrate surveys indicated that the water supply schemes were not causing any adverse environmental effects. A fish survey in the Otakeho Stream found no evidence that the weir structure presented a barrier to fish passage.
- 20. In terms of overall environmental and compliance performance by the consent holder over the last several years, this report shows that the consent holder's performance remains at a high level.
- 21. This report includes a recommendation relating to an optional review of consents 3388-3.1, 3770-3, and 9563-1 in June 2022.
- 22. Recommendations:
 - 22.1. THAT in the first instance, monitoring of consented activities in relation to the STDC water supplies in the 2021-2022 year continue at the same level as in 2020-2021.
 - 22.2. THAT eDNA analysis be undertaken as recommended in the attached Fish Survey Report during any future fish surveys.
 - 22.3. THAT should there be issues with environmental or administrative performance in 2021-2022, monitoring may be adjusted to reflect any additional investigation or intervention as found necessary.
 - 22.4. THAT the option for a review of resource consent 3388-3.1 in June 2022, as set out in condition 13 of the consent, not be exercised, on the grounds that the current conditions are adequate.

21-26 NPDC Urenui and Onaero Beach Camps Monitoring Programme Annual Report 2020-2021

- 23. New Plymouth District Council (NPDC) operates the sewage disposal systems located at Urenui Beach Camp and Onaero Bay Holiday Park. NPDC holds resource consents to allow it to discharge septic tank treated sewage to groundwater via infiltration trenches at each of the beach camps.
- 24. During the monitoring period, NPDC demonstrated an improvement required level of environmental performance and a high level of administrative compliance, with an overall level of improvement required.
- 25. NPDC holds one resource consent per beach camp, and each include a total of five special conditions setting out the requirements that NPDC must satisfy.
- 26. The Council's monitoring programme for the year under review included three inspections at each beach camp. One of these inspections included bacteriological sampling of four sites at Urenui Beach Camp, and five sites at Onaero Bay Holiday Park.
- 27. The bacteriological monitoring did not detect any adverse effects caused by the beach camps' wastewater systems during the 2020-2021 monitoring period. Although high enterococci counts were found at a coastal site at Urenui, additional sampling as part of the Council's Bathing Beach Recreational Water Quality monitoring programme returned results well under the 'Alert' level for marine waters.

- 28. Exceedances of currently consented discharge limits continued to occur from both camps during the period under review. NPDC remain under abatement notice at both camps to comply with their consent conditions. Exceedances of discharge limits occur intermittently as a result of high rainfall and groundwater infiltration into the wastewater networks. Exceedances during peak holiday periods are also influenced by higher camp occupancy and the increased wastewater volumes generated. Both consents are currently in the process of being renewed. Solutions to the current issues are being investigated through the renewal process. Cultural impact assessments are also being prepared by local iwi. The abatement notices have been extended until 31 March 2022 to enable continuation of this work alongside the consent processing. Monitoring has shown that there have been no adverse effects on the coastal environment in relation to the unauthorised incidents.
- 29. During the year under review, NPDC demonstrated a level of environmental performance with the resource consents for Urenui Beach Camp (2046-3) and Onaero Bay Holiday Park (1389-3) that requires improvement. This rating was influenced by the ongoing exceedances of discharge volume limits from both camps. No adverse effects have been identified in relation to these discharges and NPDC are being pro-active in their efforts to resolve the issues. NPDC demonstrated a high level of administrative performance with resource consents over the same period.
- 30. In terms of overall environmental and compliance performance by the consent holder over the last several years, this report shows that the consent holder's performance has declined in the year under review.
- 31. Recommendations:
 - 31.1. THAT in the first instance, monitoring of consented activities at Urenui and Onaero in the 2021-2022 year continue at the same level as in 2020-2021.
 - 31.2. THAT should there be ongoing issues with environmental or administrative performance in 2021-2022, monitoring may be adjusted to reflect any additional investigation or intervention as found necessary.

21-30 Concrete Batching Plants Monitoring Programme Annual Report 2020-2021

32. This report for the period July 2020 to June 2021 describes the monitoring programme implemented by the Taranaki Regional Council (the Council) to assess the environmental performance and consent compliance of three concrete batching plants within the Taranaki Region. The report also details the results of the monitoring undertaken and assesses the environmental effects of their activities. The three concrete batching plants covered by this programme are located in Waitara, Hawera and Stratford.

Allied Concrete Ltd., Waitara

33. The concrete batching plant located in Waitara, Allied Concrete Ltd, surrendered their resource consent during the monitoring year and no further monitoring was required of this consent.

Firth Industries, Hawera

34. Firth Industries operate a concrete batching plant located on Glover Road, Hawera in the Tangahoe catchment. The site operation involves mixing of cement, aggregate, water and additives in concrete mixing trucks for delivery to end users. Recently it has been

used only as a satellite plant. The site is also used for the storage of aggregate, sand and builders mix for retail sale.

- 35. During the year under review, Firth Industries demonstrated a high level of environmental and administrative performance.
- 36. Firth Industries holds one resource consent, which includes a total of seven conditions setting out the requirements that they must satisfy. The consent allows for the discharge of treated wastewater onto and into land and into an unnamed tributary of the Tawhiti Stream.
- 37. The Council's monitoring programme for the Hawera plant included two inspections, and sampling of the discharge and receiving waters in the vicinity of the site.

Fletcher Concrete and Infrastructure (Fletcher Concrete), Stratford

- 38. Fletcher Concrete and Infrastructure Ltd (Fletcher Concrete) operates a concrete batching plant and pre-cast manufacturing plant on a site just north of Stratford on State Highway 3 in the Kahouri catchment. Activities at the site include the storage and mixing of aggregate, cement, water and additives, as well as the manufacturing of pre-cast drainage soak-hole liners and lids, offal hole lids and troughs. The concrete batching plant is operated by their subsidiary Firth Industries, and the pre-cast facility and sales depot is operated by their subsidiary Humes Pipeline Systems (Humes).
- **39.** During the year under review, Fletcher Concrete and Infrastructure Ltd demonstrated a good level of environmental performance and high level of administrative performance, with an overall good level of environmental performance.
- 40. Fletcher Concrete holds one resource consent, which includes a total of 13 conditions setting out the requirements that the consent holder must satisfy. The consent allows for the discharge of stormwater and wastewater onto and into land and into an unnamed tributary of the Kahouri Stream.
- 41. The Council's monitoring programme for the Stratford plant included two inspections, and sampling of the discharge and receiving waters in the vicinity of the site.
- 42. There was a breach of consent conditions due to high suspended solids in the discharge. The effects on the receiving waters were negligible or minor at most and the consent holder was quick to respond and address the issues.
- 43. Recommendations:
 - 43.1. THAT in the first instance, monitoring of discharges from Firth Industries in the 2021-2022 year continues at the same level as in 2020-2021.
 - 43.2. THAT should there be issues with environmental or administrative performance in 2021-2022, monitoring may be adjusted to reflect any additional investigation or intervention as found necessary.
 - 43.3. THAT in the first instance monitoring of discharges from Fletcher Concrete in the 2021-2022 year continues at the same level as in 2020-2021.
 - 43.4. THAT should there be issues with environmental or administrative performance in 2021-2022, monitoring may be adjusted to reflect any additional investigation or intervention as found necessary.

21-31 Hickman JD 1997 Family Trust Monitoring Programme Annual Report 2020-2021

- 44. The Hickman JD 1997 Family Trust (the Trust) operates a road transport depot located on Waitara Road at Brixton, Waitara, in the Waiongana catchment. The operations at this site mainly involve packaged dairy related products. Goods are stored under roofed catchments with the remaining areas being paved or gravel. The site also has a parts wash facility with wastewater draining to sumps and then to the stormwater system. There is a truck wash onsite that the Trust had advised drains to trade waste.
- 45. During the monitoring period, an improvement in the Trust's level of environmental performance and administrative compliance was required.
- 46. The Trust holds one resource consent, which includes a total of nine conditions setting out the requirements that the Trust must satisfy. The consent allows the Trust to discharge stormwater from their road transport depot and washwater from a parts wash on their site into an unnamed tributary of the Waiongana Stream.
- 47. The Council's monitoring programme for the year under review included two inspections and four water samples collected for physicochemical analysis.
- 48. The monitoring showed that although the products transported through the site were well managed, the sediment control systems were not maintained to the standard required to ensure consent compliance, as demonstrated by the results of the physicochemical sampling. By comparison with previous years, the monitoring indicated a decline over the previous three monitoring years. There was one unauthorised incident recording non-compliance in respect of this consent holder during the period under review due to an exceedance of the suspended solids discharge limit on the consent.
- 49. An improvement in the Trust's environmental and administrative performance is required. During the year under review inadequate maintenance of the treatment systems on the discharges resulted in a breach of the suspended solids limit on the consent. While this likely had a minor impact on the receiving waters, as no changes were observed between upstream and downstream sites, an improvement is still required to mitigate any further environmental impacts.
- 50. In terms of overall environmental and compliance performance by the consent holder over the last several years, this report shows that the consent holder's performance remains at a level that requires improvement in the year under review.
- 51. Recommendations:
 - 51.1. THAT in the first instance, monitoring of consented activities at Hickman JD 1997 Family Trust in the 2021-2022 year continues at the same level as programmed for the 2020-2021 year.
 - 51.2. THAT should there be issues with environmental or administrative performance in 2021-2022, monitoring may be adjusted to reflect any additional investigation or intervention as found necessary.

21-39 Greymouth Petroleum Ltd Northern Sites Monitoring Programme Annual Report 2020-2021

- 52. Greymouth Petroleum Ltd (the Company) operates the Turangi Production Station located on Turangi Road at Motunui, in the Parahaki catchment. The Turangi Production Station processes oil and gas from from the Company's northern Taranaki operations, including the Ohanga, Onaero and Turangi group of wellsites. The Company also operate the Kowhai-A Production Station, located on Ngatimaru Road at Tikorangi. The Kowhai-A Production Station processes product from the Kowhai-A, B, C and D wellsites.
- 53. During the monitoring period, Greymouth Petroleum Ltd demonstrated a good level of environmental performance and a high level of administrative compliance, with an overall good level of environmental performance.
- 54. The Company holds four resource consents in relation to the Turangi and Kowhai-A production stations, which include a total of 80 conditions setting out the requirements that the Company must satisfy. The Company holds two consents to discharge stormwater and two consents to discharge emissions related to production activities into the air.
- 55. During the year under review two stormwater consents at the Turangi Production Station were surrendered after being combined, with an additional discharge, into one new consent covering the whole site. An additional consent relating to the discharge of treated stormwater and produced water from exploration activities at the Turangi-B wellsite was also actively monitored during the period under review.
- 56. The Council's monitoring programme for the year under review included three inspections of the Turangi and Kowhai-A production stations, along with an annual inspection of wellsites associated with the production stations. Thirteen water samples were collected for physicochemical analysis, two biomonitoring surveys of receiving waters were conducted, and two ambient air quality surveys were undertaken in relation to the Turangi Production Station.
- 57. The monitoring showed that the production station sites were well managed. Sampling of discharges and receiving waters in relation to Turangi Production Station did not find any significant adverse effects at the time of sampling, while biomonitoring in the receiving waters did not show any effect from discharges on the communities in the stream.
- 58. There were no adverse effects on the environment resulting from the exercise of the air discharge consent. Ambient air quality monitoring at the Turangi Production Station showed that levels of carbon monoxide, combustible gases, PM10 particulates, and nitrogen oxides were all below levels of concern at the time of sampling. No offensive or objectionable odours were detected beyond the boundary during inspections.
- 59. Monitoring undertaken at the Turangi-B wellsite found evidence of stormwater discharging directly to the Parahaki Stream. An abatement notice was issued requiring the cessation of this. The matter remained unresolved at the end of the monitoring period.
- 60. In terms of overall environmental and compliance performance by the consent holder over the last several years, this report shows that the consent holder's performance remains at a good or high level.
- 61. Recommendations:

- 61.1. THAT in the first instance, monitoring of consented activities at the Turangi and Kowhai-A production stations and associated wellsites in the 2021-2022 year continue at the same level as in 2020-2021.
- 61.2. THAT should there be issues with environmental or administrative performance in 2021-2022, monitoring may be adjusted to reflect any additional investigation or intervention as found necessary.

21-41 Todd Petroleum McKee Mangahewa Production Station Monitoring Programme Annual Report 2020-2021

- 62. Todd Energy Ltd (Todd Energy) operates a petroleum production station located on Otaraoa Road near Tikorangi, bridging the Waitara and Onaero catchments. The McKee and Mangahewa Production Station (MMPS) processes condensate and natural gas from Todd Energy's McKee and Mangahewa groups of wellsites and includes electricity cogeneration and LPG production facilities.
- 63. During the monitoring period, Todd Energy Ltd demonstrated a high level of environmental and administrative performance.
- 64. Todd Energy holds ten resource consents, which include a total of 104 conditions setting out the requirements that Todd Energy must satisfy. Todd Energy holds one consent to allow for the take and use of water, three consents to discharge stormwater and wastewater, three consents to discharge emissions into the air, one consent to allow the diversion of unnamed tributaries of the Mangahewa Stream, and two consents regarding the installation and use of structures.
- 65. The Council's monitoring programme for the year under review included five inspections, nine water samples and six stream sediment samples collected for physicochemical analysis, two biomonitoring surveys of receiving waters, one fish survey, and two ambient air quality surveys. Todd Energy provided results of impounded stormwater samples and information on flaring and various water abstractions through the year.
- 66. Stormwater system inspections showed that discharges from the site complied with consent conditions at the time.
- 67. Although the summer survey recorded an increase in taxa richness, the pattern of low taxa richness at site 2 observed for ten consecutive prior surveys indicates that the macroinvertebrate communities are likely experiencing detrimental impacts downstream of the MMPS, which are primarily expressed through reduced macroinvertebrate diversity. Hydrocarbon contamination of sediments was proposed as a potential cause for this and Todd Energy commissioned an investigation into the contamination. Initial conclusions are that the contamination is a result of a prior event (rather than current activities at the site) and that periodic stream bank erosion is releasing hydrocarbons. Todd Energy have undertaken to fence and plant approximately 100 m of bank upstream with the goal of minimising erosion and the release of legacy contaminants.
- 68. Although the results of the fish survey undertaken during the current monitoring period, along with the results of previous monitoring, did not conclusively conclude that the weir poses a significant barrier to fish passage it is recommended that Todd investigate improvements that could be made to the weir to increase the likelihood of comprehensive passage for fish.

- 69. There were no adverse effects on the environment resulting from the exercise of the air discharge consents. The ambient air quality monitoring at the production station showed that levels of carbon monoxide, combustible gases, PM10 particulates, and nitrogen oxides were all below levels of concern at the time of sampling. No offensive or objectionable odours were detected beyond the boundary during inspections.
- 70. In terms of overall environmental and compliance performance by the consent holder over the last several years, this report shows that the consent holder's performance remains at a high level. There were no unauthorised incidents recorded by the Council in relation to Todd Energy's activities.
- 71. Recommendations:
 - 71.1. THAT in the first instance, monitoring of consented activities at McKee Mangahewa Production Station in the 2021-2022 year continue at the same level as in 2020-2021.
 - 71.2. THAT should there be issues with environmental or administrative performance in 2021-2022, monitoring may be adjusted to reflect any additional investigation or intervention as found necessary.

21-45 Lower Waiwhakaiho Airshed Monitoring Programme Annual Report 2020-2021

- 72. The Lower Waiwhakaiho area of New Plymouth accommodates several industries that include two abrasive blasting operations and an asphalt plant. The companies monitored during the period under review were Downer EDI Works Ltd, Dialog Fitzroy Ltd, and Katere Surface Coatings Ltd. The companies hold resource consents to allow them to discharge emissions into the air.
- 73. The companies assessed in this Lower Waiwhakaiho Air Discharge Compliance Monitoring Programme all demonstrated a high level of environmental and administrative performance.
- 74. The companies hold three resource consents, which include a total of 72 special conditions setting out the requirements that the companies must satisfy.
- 75. The Council's monitoring during the year under review included 10 inspections and two deposition gauge surveys.
- 76. The deposition gauge surveys found that, in relation to dust resulting in deposited particulates, ambient air quality in the area during the year under review was high.
- 77. Overall, the Downer EDI Works Ltd site was found to be well maintained. There was a measured improvement in site management at the Dialog Fitzroy Ltd site, and an improvement in site management at the Katere Surface Coatings Ltd site.
- 78. Summary of recommendations:
 - 78.1. THAT monitoring of consented activities at the Downer EDI Works Ltd site in the 2021-2022 year continues at the same level as in 2020-2021.
 - 78.2. THAT monitoring of consented activities at the Dialog Fitzroy Ltd site in the 2021-2022 year continues at the same level as in 2020-2021.
 - 78.3. THAT monitoring of consented activities of Katere Surface Coatings Ltd in the 2021-2022 year continues at the same level as in 2020-2021.

78.4. THAT should there be issues with environmental or administrative performance in 2021-2022, monitoring may be adjusted to reflect any additional investigation or intervention as found necessary.

21-52 STDC Coastal Structure Monitoring Programme Annual Report 2020-2021

- 79. South Taranaki District Council (STDC) holds coastal permits for various structures along the South Taranaki coast.
- 80. During the monitoring period, STDC demonstrated a high level of environmental and administrative performance.
- 81. STDC holds 11 coastal permits relating to coastal structures, which include a total of 51 conditions setting out the requirements that they must satisfy. STDC holds three coastal permits relating to boat ramps, wharves and jetties, one permit relating to an access structure and seven permits relating to coastal protection from erosion. A further two coastal permits are held for outfall structures which are the subject of other monitoring programmes, namely, the Patea Wastewater Treatment Plant, and the Opunake Wastewater Treatment Plant, and are therefore not discussed in this report.
- 82. The Council's monitoring programme for the period under review included an annual inspection of the various structures.
- 83. The monitoring found that the majority of the coastal structures were compliant with consent conditions. At Opunake Beach, one structure was found in a state of disrepair and was deemed to be non-compliant. STDC is currently making arrangements to replace this structure. No definitive environmental effects were discovered in 2020-2021. It should be recognised, however, that the ability of the current monitoring programme to detect such effects is limited. Additional monitoring activities commenced during the year that will greatly help to address this issue going forward.
- 84. In terms of overall environmental and compliance performance by the consent holder over the last several years, this report shows that the consent holder's performance has improved in the year under review.
- 85. This report includes recommendations to alter the monitoring programme.
- 86. Recommendations:
 - 86.1. THAT monitoring of the STDC coastal structures shall be undertaken in accordance with the requirements set out in Section 3.5 of this Compliance Report, and as stipulated in the Draft Monitoring Plan provided to Council on 30 June 2021 (TRC document 2813897).
 - 86.2. THAT the Denby Road (Waihi Beach) beach access structure is no longer monitored and reported on, on the basis that the structure has been removed.
 - 86.3. THAT STDC shall comply with Rule 36 (structure maintenance, minor alteration or minor extension) in the Proposed Coastal Plan for Taranaki if maintenance is required on any consented coastal structures.
 - 86.4. THAT should there be issues with environmental or administrative performance in 2021-2022, monitoring may be adjusted to reflect any additional investigation or intervention as found necessary.
 - 86.5. THAT the option for a review of resource consent 4573-2 in June 2022, as set out in condition 3 of the consent, be exercised, on the grounds that the consent is currently inadequate to prevent adverse environmental effects as it does not necessitate appropriate monitoring to determine the effects of the structures.

21-53 Greymouth Petroleum Ltd Deep Well Injection Monitoring Programme Annual Report 2020-2021

- 87. Greymouth Petroleum Ltd and its subsidiaries (the Company) operate a number of wellsites across the Taranaki region, with major fields located in the Tikorangi and Kaimiro areas. Each wellsite contains varying numbers of producing wells and associated production infrastructure.
- 88. During the monitoring period the Company demonstrated a high level of environmental and administrative performance.
- 89. The Company held nine resource consents for DWI activities during the review period, which include a total of 139 conditions setting out the requirements that the Company must satisfy. Five of the nine consents were exercised during the period being reported. One consent expired (7068-1) and one consent was issued (10845-1) during the monitoring year.
- 90. The Council's monitoring programme for the year under review included five annual inspections, two injectate samples and 14 groundwater samples collected for physicochemical analysis. The monitoring programme also included a significant data review component, with all injection data submitted by the Company assessed for compliance on receipt.
- 91. The monitoring showed that the Company's DWI activities were being carried out in compliance with the conditions of the applicable resource consents. There is no evidence of any issues with any injection well currently in use, or the ability of the receiving formation to accept injected fluids. The results of groundwater quality monitoring undertaken show no adverse effects of the activity at on local groundwater resources. Inspections undertaken during the monitoring year found sites being operated in a professional manner and there were no unauthorised incidents in relation to any of the Company's DWI consents.
- 92. In terms of overall environmental and compliance performance by the Company over the last several years, this report shows that the Company's performance remains at a generally high level.
- 93. Recommendations:
 - 93.1. THAT in the first instance, monitoring of consented activities in the 2021-2022 year continue at the same level as in 2020-2021.
 - 93.2. THAT should there be issues with environmental or administrative performance in 2021-2022, monitoring may be adjusted to reflect any additional investigation or intervention as found necessary.
 - 93.3. THAT the option for a review of resource consents in June 2022, as set out in the respective consent conditions not be exercised.

21-58 Ballance Agri-Nutrients (Kapuni) Ltd Monitoring Programme Annual Report 2020-2021

- 94. Ballance Agri-Nutrients (Kapuni) Ltd (the Company) operates an ammonia urea manufacturing plant located near Kapuni, in the Kapuni Stream catchment.
- 95. During the monitoring period, Ballance Agri-Nutrients Ltd demonstrated a high level of environmental and administrative performance.
- 96. The Company hold seven resource consents, which include a total of 74 conditions setting out the requirements that the Company must satisfy. The Company holds

resource consents to allow it to take water from the Waingongoro River, the Kapuni Stream and from groundwater; to discharge to land, to the Kapuni Stream and an unnamed tributary of the Kapuni Stream; and to discharge emissions into the air.

- 97. The Company and the Council monitor the exercise of the resource consents. The monitoring programme includes site inspections, sampling of effluent, discharge and receiving waters (both ground and surface) for physicochemical analysis, and biological surveys of streams. Particular attention is paid to the management of the irrigation disposal system, and its effects on groundwater quality.
- 98. The Council's monitoring programme included four inspections, physicochemical analysis of four stream samples, two stormwater/discharge samples, two effluent grab samples, two composite effluent samples, and two groundwater samples, two air quality surveys and one depositional gauging.
- 99. Abstraction volumes from Waingongoro River complied with the consent limit. A contribution of \$30,000 towards riparian planting and management in Waingongoro catchment was made, the ninth of ten annual payments required by consent conditions.
- 100. The groundwater monitoring indicates the presence of elevated total nitrogen concentrations in shallow groundwater. This is in part a result of heavy applications of nitrogen (effluent) early in the life of the plant. Current effluent application is considerably lower than historic application rates. However, nitrate concentrations in the soil profile underneath the irrigation areas and in the tributaries flowing through or adjacent to the site remain elevated.
- 101. A narrow but concentrated plume of ammonia is present in the groundwater resulting from previous leaks in a finished effluent catch basin. This basin has since been repaired. A second more recent and more concentrated ammonia plume extends from the plant area. Both plumes have pump and treatment systems operating, with the contaminated groundwater pumped back through the plant and waste treatment system. Both plumes are closely monitored and neither plume extends beyond the boundary of the Company's site. However, current results indicate that one monitoring bore, but not other down gradient bores in close proximity, showed a large increase in total nitrogen. This suggests that the plume had moved a short distance. Monitoring of the bore has been increased but further action may need to be taken.
- 102. Monitoring of the Kapuni Stream and its tributaries around the plant, through testing for nitrogen, as well as biomonitoring involving macroinvertebrate and fish surveys, has not detected any detrimental impact on the stream health caused by discharges from the Company's site.
- 103. Air monitoring of the site and the neighbourhood shows no significant impact on the surrounding environment in relation to the operation of the ammonia urea plant.
- 104. During the monitoring period, no unauthorised incidents were identified, or reported to the Council.
- 105. In terms of overall environmental and compliance performance by the consent holder over the last several years, this report shows that the consent holder's performance remains at a high level.
- 106. Recommendations:
 - 106.1. THAT in the first instance, monitoring of consented activities at the Company's AUP in the 2021-2022 year continue at the same level as in 2020-2021.

- 106.2. THAT should there be issues with environmental or administrative performance in 2021-2022, monitoring may be adjusted to reflect any additional investigation or intervention as found necessary.
- 106.3. THAT monitoring of the effects of abstraction from the Waingongoro River be discussed in consultation with interested parties, as provided in condition 10 and 11 on consent 0596-3.

21-67 STDC Closed Landfills Monitoring Programme Annual Report 2020-2021

- 107. South Taranaki District Council (STDC) holds consents to cover the discharge of leachate and stormwater from seven closed landfills. The landfills are at Kaponga and Manaia in the Waiokura catchment, Patea in the Patea catchment, Opunake in the Otahi catchment, Hawera in the Tangahoe catchment, Otakeho in the Taikatu catchment, and Eltham in the Waingongoro catchment.
- 108. During the monitoring period, STDC demonstrated a high level of environmental and administrative performance for the Eltham, Hawera, Kaponga, Manaia, Opunake and Patea landfills.
- 109. The report also details the results of the monitoring undertaken and assesses the environmental effects of STDC's activities at the Eltham, Hawera, Kaponga, Manaia, Opunake, and Patea landfills. Triennial monitoring of the Otakeho closed landfill was not scheduled to take place during the year under review. As such, environmental and administrative performance in relation to the Otakeho closed landfill consent were not assessed.
- 110. STDC holds 10 resource consents, consisting of eight discharge of stormwater and/or leachate to water consents, one discharge to air consent, and one land use consent. These consents include a total of 62 conditions setting out the requirements that STDC must satisfy.
- 111. To monitor compliance with these conditions during the 2020-2021 year, Council staff conducted 11 inspections and collected 31 discharge and receiving environment samples.
- 112. In terms of overall environmental and compliance performance by the consent holder over the last several years, this report shows that the consent holder's performance remained at a high level in the year under review.
- 113. This report includes a recommendation relating to an optional review of consent 5831-2.
- 114. Summary of recommendations:
 - 114.1. THAT in the first instance, the monitoring of discharges from the closed landfill at Eltham in the 2021-2022 year continue at the same level as in 2020-2021.
 - 114.2. THAT should there be any issues with environmental or administrative performance in 2021-2022, monitoring of the closed landfill at Eltham may be adjusted to reflect any additional investigation or intervention as found necessary.
 - 114.3. THAT in the first instance, monitoring of discharges from Hawera landfill in the 2021-2022 year remains similar to the 2020-2021 monitoring programme.
 - 114.4. THAT should there be any issues with environmental or administrative performance in the 2021-2022, monitoring of the closed Hawera landfill may be adjusted to reflect any additional investigation or intervention as found necessary.

- 114.5. THAT in the first instance, the Kaponga landfill triennial monitoring programme remains in place with monitoring next scheduled for the 2023-2024 period.
- 114.6. THAT should there be any issues with environmental or administrative performance in 2021-2022, monitoring of the Kaponga landfill may be adjusted to reflect any additional investigation or intervention as found necessary.
- 114.7. THAT in the first instance, the monitoring of discharges from the closed landfill at Manaia in the 2021-2022 year continues at the same level as in 2020-2021.
- 114.8. THAT should there be issues with environmental or administrative performance in 2021-2022, monitoring of the Manaia landfill may be adjusted to reflect any additional investigation or intervention as found necessary.
- 114.9. THAT in the first instance, monitoring of discharges from Opunake landfill in the 2021-2022 year continues at the same level as in 2020-2021.
- 114.10. THAT should there be any issues with the environmental or administrative performance in 2021-2022, monitoring of the Opunake landfill may be adjusted to reflect any additional investigation or intervention as found necessary.
- 114.11. THAT in the first instance, the Otakeho landfill triennial monitoring programme remains in place with monitoring next scheduled to be implemented in the 2022-2023 period.
- 114.12. THAT should there be issues with environmental or administrative performance in 2020-2021, monitoring of the Otakeho landfill may be adjusted to reflect any additional investigation or intervention as found necessary.
- 114.13. THAT in the first instance, the monitoring of discharges from the closed Patea landfill in the 2021-2022 year remains unchanged from that of 2020-2021.
- 114.14. THAT should there be issues with environmental or administrative performance in 2021-2022, monitoring of the Patea landfill may be adjusted to reflect any additional investigation or intervention as found necessary.

21-68 Candyman Trust Monitoring Programme Annual Report 2020-2021

- 115. The Candyman Trust (the Trust) operates a cleanfill being undertaken for the purpose of reclaiming part of an existing man-made pond located on Manutahi Road South of Bell Block, in the Waiongana catchment. The man-made pond was created by previous quarrying activities on the site.
- 116. During the monitoring period, Candyman Trust demonstrated a high level of environmental and administrative performance.
- 117. The Trust holds one resource consents that includes a total of nine conditions setting out the requirements that the Trust must satisfy. The Trust holds a consents to allow it to reclaim part of a man-made pond by the discharge of cleanfill at this site.
- 118. The Council's monitoring programme for the year under review included one inspection with a follow-up site visit.
- 119. There were no unauthorised incidents recording non-compliance in respect of this consent holder during the period under review.
- 120. The monitoring showed that, with the exception of the noncompliance outlined below, the site was generally well managed and the other conditions of the consent were being complied with.
- 121. Recommendations:

- 121.1. THAT in the first instance, monitoring of consented activities at the Trust's site in the 2021-2022 year be amended from that undertaken in 2020-2021, by increasing the number of inspections to three due to this being a programme covering a full monitoring year.
- 121.2. THAT should there be issues with environmental or administrative performance in 2021-2022, monitoring may be adjusted to reflect any additional investigation or intervention as found necessary.

21-69 Westown Haulage Cowling Road Monitoring Programme Annual Report 2020-2021

- 122. Westown Haulage Limited/Westown Agriculture Limited (the Company) operates a cleanfill located on Cowling Road in Hurdon, in the Huatoki catchment . The activity relates to the filling of the southern portion of a gully with cleanfill material, with a contingency to receive a small amount of untreated sawdust from the Taranaki Pine site in Bell Block. The activity commenced towards the end of the 2020-2021 monitoring year.
- 123. During the monitoring period, the Company demonstrated a high level of environmental performance and a good level of administrative compliance, with an overall high level of environmental performance.
- 124. The Company holds one resource consent for the discharge to land, which include a total of 15 conditions setting out the requirements that the Company must satisfy.
- 125. The Council's monitoring programme for the year under review included 2 inspections and 2 water samples collected for physicochemical analysis.
- 126. The monitoring showed that only acceptable materials were discharged at the site during the period under review. Although the suspended solids concentration was slightly elevated downstream of the site when sampled, there was a contribution from sediment disturbed from the bed of the shallow tributary. In addition to this, minor improvements to the sediment controls on site were discussed and had been implemented at the following inspection.
- 127. During the year, the Company demonstrated a high level of environmental and good level of administrative performance with the resource consents as defined in Section 1.1.4. The Company has the relevant internal planning and operational systems in place and is working towards the collation of this information in the required erosion and sediment control plan for the site.
- 128. Recommendations:
 - 128.1. THAT in the first instance, monitoring of consented activities at the cleanfill site in the 2021-2022 year be amended from that undertaken in 2020-2021, by increasing the number of inspections to three inspections for the full year of monitoring.
 - 128.2. THAT should there be issues with environmental or administrative performance in 2021-2022, monitoring may be adjusted to reflect any additional investigation or intervention as found necessary.

Purpose

- 1. The purpose of this memorandum is to allow the Council to consider and receive the summary of the incidents, compliance monitoring non-compliances and enforcement for the period 29 October 2021 to 11 January 2022.
- 2. The annual inspection for farm dairy effluent monitoring programme commences in September each year and usually finishes around March, however follow up inspections and winter milking inspections are also carried out during the rest of the year.

Executive summary

Incidents

- 3. There are one hundred and thirty four (134) incidents reported.
- 4. Eighty three (83) of the incidents were found to be compliant and thirty six (36) were found to be non-compliant. Fifteen (15) of the incidents reported relate to non-compliances from previous periods (updates). The action taken on the incidents is set out for Members information.
- 5. For the ninth reporting period in a row there continues to be a high number of incidents found to be compliant.

Compliance monitoring non-compliances

- 6. There are forty nine (49) compliance monitoring non-compliances reported. Fifteen (15) of the compliance monitoring non-compliances reported are updates from previous periods.
- 7. Forty (40) of the non-compliances reported are as a result of the annual dairy inspection round.

Recommendations

That the Taranaki Regional Council:

- a) <u>receives</u> this memorandum Incident, Compliance Monitoring Non-compliances and Enforcement Summary 29 October 2021 to 11 January 2022.
- b) <u>receives</u> the summary of the incidents, compliance monitoring non-compliances and enforcement for the period from 29 October 2021 to 11 January 2022, <u>notes</u> the action taken by staff acting under delegated authority and <u>adopts</u> the recommendations therein.

Background

- 8. The Council receives and responds to pollution events and public complaints throughout the year. Consent compliance monitoring undertaken can also identify non-compliance. This information is recorded in the IRIS database together with the results of investigations and any follow-up actions. Such incidents and non-compliances are publicly reported to the Council through the Consents and Regulatory Committee via the Incidents, Compliance Monitoring Non-compliances and Enforcement Report or the Annual Compliance Monitoring Reports.
- 9. Attached is the summary of the Incidents, Compliance Monitoring Non-compliances and Enforcement for the period from 29 October 2021 to 11 January 2022.
- 10. Staff have been delegated by the Council to undertake enforcement actions. The enforcement policy and procedures are approved by the Council and then consistently implemented and reported on by staff.

Disclosure Restrictions

11. The incident register information presentation was reviewed in 2014-2015 to increase reader understanding in this complex area. The first section addresses compliant incidents and can be publically discussed. The second section provides an update on non-compliant incidents from previous meetings and where an incident has been resolved it can be publically discussed. The third and fourth sections provide information on non-compliant incidents and non-compliances found during compliance monitoring during the period that are still under investigation and staff are limited in terms of public disclosure of information, while the investigation is ongoing and enforcement responses have not been determined. The incident flow chart and definition of terms provide further operational detail.

Discussion

12. Council responds to all complaints received with most complaints responded to within four hours. This usually involves a site visit. Responses to complaints and non-compliances with rules in the Council's regional plans, resource consents and the Resource Management Act 1991 are recorded in the IRIS database. Where necessary, appropriate advisory or enforcement actions are undertaken. The latter may include issuing an inspection, abatement or infringement notice, or initiating a prosecution. Where an infringement notice or prosecution is possible, details of the information in the Incidents, Compliance Monitoring Non-compliances and Enforcement agenda item and staff comment will be restricted for legal disclosure reasons. Further information will be

provided at a later date to the Council and for prosecutions a detailed report will be provided for information purposes, in the confidential section of the agenda.

- 13. A summary of Incidents, Compliance Monitoring Non-compliances and Enforcement for the period 29 October 2021 to 11 January 2022 is attached. The 'compliant' incidents are presented first in a table and the 'non-compliant' incidents are presented after in a more detailed summary, followed by the compliance monitoring non-compliances.
- 14. Generally incidents in the 'compliant' table have a recommendation of 'no further action'. However, an incident is considered 'compliant' until such time as a non-compliance is found. Therefore occasionally an incident in the 'compliant' table will have a recommendation of 'investigation continuing', if an ongoing investigation is still underway to confirm compliance.
- 15. A series of graphs are also attached comparing the number of incidents between 2016-2017 and 2021-2022, and also showing how the incidents are tracking in 2021-2022 in relation to environment type and compliance status. There is a graph showing the non-compliances found during compliance monitoring. There is also a graph showing enforcement action taken to date during 2021-2022.
- 16. The data in the graphs for 2021-2022 to date is showing that there are more incidents but less compliance monitoring non-compliances. Although in the first month of this period there is limited data.

Decision-making considerations

17. Part 6 (Planning, decision-making and accountability) of the *Local Government Act* 2002 has been considered and documented in the preparation of this agenda item. The recommendations made in this item comply with the decision-making obligations of the *Act*.




- the defendant can prove that he or she did not know, and could not reasonably be expected to have known that the offence was to be or was being committed, or

- the action or event could not reasonably have been foreseen or been provided against by the defendant.





Incident and Enforcement Graphs to 31 December 2021




