

6. Changes to the Duration of Consents Related to Freshwater - New Analysis

6.1 Mr F Kiddle spoke to the Committee to inform of the developments in the regional sector's thinking of the changes to the maximum duration available for freshwater consents.

 - (i) the consent authority may grant the affected resource consent for a fixed period or require that it expire by a fixed date; and
 - (ii) in either case, the duration of the consent must not exceed 5 years after when rules in the region's first Natural and Built Environment Plan take legal effect
- c) <u>noted</u> that when relevant rules in the region's first Natural and Built Environment Plan will take legal effect at this stage is estimated to be 30 June 2032
- d) requested that, when processing affected resource consent applications, Council officers consider (alongside all other relevant matters) the most up to date estimate of the Taranaki region's Natural Built Environment Act date and the benefits of avoiding an unmanageable number of resource consents expiring on the same date

- e) <u>noted</u> that recommendations b), c) and d) supersede recommendations b), c), d) and e) in the *Changes to the Duration of Consents Related to Freshwater* memorandum (#3193096) presented at the 29 August 2023 meeting of the Operations and Regulatory Committee

Purpose

1. The purpose of this memorandum is to seek approval to extend the date by which Council must conclude negotiation of a Relationship Agreement with Te Nehenehenui, the Post-Settlement Governance Entity acting on behalf of Ngāti Maniapoto.

Executive summary

- 2. The Maniapoto Claims Settlement Act 2022 (the Act) was passed into law on 27 September 2022 and required that a relationship agreement be entered into by 28 September 2023 unless an extension is agreed.
- 3. The Act requires Te Nehenehenui to develop a Joint Management Agreement with Waikato Regional Council, Waitomo District Council and Ōtorohanga District Council. It also requires Te Nehenehenui to develop a relationship agreement with Manawatū-Whanganui (Horizons) Regional Council, Ruapehu District Council and our Council.
- 4. The Act contains a number of provisions relating to the scope of the relationship agreement. These include a number of matters in relation to Ngā Wai o Maniapoto and activities within the catchment affecting Ngā Wai o Maniapoto. The relationship agreement will set out how parties will work together in good faith towards a common purpose. The Settlement Act sets this purpose as to care and protect Ngā Wai o Maniapoto; and to restore and maintain the quality and integrity of the waters of Ngā Wai o Maniapoto. This then leads to a focus on provisions under the RMA as the primary management tool for freshwater. A relationship agreement can, however, relate to any other pieces of legislation relevant to achieving the purpose, the most prominent being the *Local Government Act* 2002 (LGA).
- 5. While progress on the development of a relationship agreement has been made, an agreement was not reached by the 28 September deadline. It is therefore proposed that Council and Te Nehenehenui formally agree to extend the deadline by which agreement needs to be reached on the content of the relationship agreement 1 May 2024.

Recommendations

That the Taranaki Regional Council:

- a) <u>receives</u> the memorandum *Te Nehenehenui Relationship Agreement Extension* dated 12 December 2023
- b) <u>agrees</u> to Option 1: extend the date by which a Relationship Agreement must be agreed with Te Nehenehenui to 1 May 2024
- c) <u>notes</u> the Maniapoto Claims Settlement Act 2022 requires the Council to negotiate a Relationship Agreement with Te Nehenehenui by 28 September 2023 or such other date as may be agreed between the parties
- d) <u>determines</u> that this decision be recognised as not significant in terms of section 76 of the *Local Government Act* 2002
- e) <u>determines</u> that it has complied with the decision-making provisions of the *Local Government Act* 2002 to the extent necessary in relation to this decision; and in accordance with section 79 of the Act, <u>determines</u> that it does not require further information, further assessment of options or further analysis of costs and benefits, or advantages and disadvantages prior to making a decision on this matter.

Background

- 6. The area of interest set out in *Maniapoto Claims Settlement Act* 2022 (the Settlement Act) includes a portion of Taranaki. Within this area, the Council is required to agree a relationship agreement with Te Nehenehenui.
- 7. In addition to what the Settlement Act requires the relationship agreement to canvas, Te Nehenehenui has proposed additional matters for inclusion in the relationship agreement. These are:
 - Development opportunities to support organizational and personal development, training and cultural competency (e.g. secondments, workshops, joint scholarships, community awareness programmes, and employment opportunities within councils for Ngāti Maniapoto).
 - The identification and management of sites of significance to Ngāti Maniapoto, including information sharing protocols.
 - Engagement to improve the application and effectiveness of the Ngāti Maniapoto Environmental Management Plan.

Maniapoto and Ngā lwi o Taranaki

- 8. The Crown's decision to acknowledge Ngāti Maniapoto's area of interest as extending into Taranaki is not without issue. This area of interest extends over around half of Ngāti Tama's rohe. There is a long and complicated history between Ngāti Tama and Ngāti Maniapoto, including overlapping areas of customary interest.
- This played out most recently when Ngāti Tama opposed New Plymouth District Council (NPDC) voluntarily entering into a relationship agreement with Ngāti Maniapoto. It is understood that Te Nehenehenui has subsequently withdrawn their request to NPDC.

Issues

10. There is a need for Council to make a decision about the proposal to extend the timeframe within which it is required to negotiate a relationship agreement with Te Nehenehenui.

Discussion

- 11. The Settlement Act is clear on what the relationship agreement must cover and the date by which an agreement should be reached.
- 12. Te Nehenehenui are currently working through the process of reaching agreement on a JMA with the 3 northern councils as outlined in the Act. While Te Nehenehenui have been working through the JMA process, they have not be able to give their full attention to the development of the relationship agreement with the 3 southern councils. Hence, the proposal to extend the deadline for a relationship agreement.
- 13. Both Horizons and Ruapehu District Council have agreed to the extension of the deadline for an agreement to be reached.

Options

- 14. Option 1: extend the date by which a Relationship Agreement must be agreed with Te Nehenehenui to 1 May 2024. In the interest of working in good faith, this is the preferred option.
- 15. Option 2: decline the request to extend the deadline for reaching agreement. This would contradict the decision of Horizons and Ruapehu District and it would be counterproductive to the relationship between Council and Te Nehenehenui.

Significance

16. A decision in accordance with the recommended approach is not considered significant. The decision being made relates to a procedural matter, which is provided for within relevant legislation and which is also supported by Te Nehenehenui.

Financial considerations—LTP/Annual Plan

17. This memorandum and the associated recommendations are consistent with the Council's adopted Long-Term Plan and estimates. Any financial information included in this memorandum has been prepared in accordance with generally accepted accounting practice.

Policy considerations

18. Purpose

 The purpose of this memorandum is to seek approval to extend the date by which Council must conclude negotiation of a Joint Management Agreement (JMA) with Ngāti Maru.

Executive summary

- 2. The Ngāti Maru (Taranaki) Claims Settlement Act 2022 (the Act) was passed into law on 30 March 2022 and required that a JMA be agreed by 30 November 2022.
- 3. The Act contains a number of provisions relating to the content of the JMA and the principles that must be applied to the way in which the parties work together. These include a number of matters that need to be agreed relating to the operation of and provision of information to the Waitara River Committee and other Iwi authorities involved with the formation of this committee. As such it is appropriate that the other Iwi authorities also be involved in the discussions relating to the JMA content and that there be a strong linkage between the JMA and the Heads of Agreement required under the New Plymouth District Council (Waitara Lands) Act 2018.
- 4. While progress is being made, it will not be possible for an agreement to be reached before 31 December 2023. It is therefore proposed that Council and Ngāti Maru formally agree to extend the deadline by which agreement needs to be reached on the content of the JMA to 31 December 2024.

Recommendations

That the Taranaki Regional Council:

- a) <u>receives</u> the memorandum *Ngāti Maru Joint Management Agreement* dated 8 November 2022
- b) <u>agrees</u> to Option 1: extend the date by which a Joint Management Agreement must be agreed with Ngāti Maru to 31 December 2024
- c) <u>determines</u> that this decision be recognised as not significant in terms of section 76 of the *Local Government Act* 2002

d) <u>determines</u> that it has complied with the decision-making provisions of the *Local Government Act* 2002 to the extent necessary in relation to this decision; and in accordance with section 79 of the Act, <u>determines</u> that it does not require further information, further assessment of options or further analysis of costs and benefits, or advantages and disadvantages prior to making a decision on this matter.

Background

- 5. The Ngāti Maru (Taranaki) Claims Settlement Act 2022 (the Act) places a requirement on Council to negotiate a Joint Management Agreement (JMA) with Ngāti Maru by 30 November 2022, or such other date as may be agreed with Ngāti Maru.
- 6. Under the Act the JMA is required to explicitly address a number of matters relating to how the Waitara River Committee, and the other Iwi authorities involved with the Waitara River Committee, might have input into Council consenting, monitoring and plan development processes under the Resource Management Act 1991. As such many of the provisions represent an extension of the requirements included in the New Plymouth District Council (Waitara Lands) Act 2018.
- 7. A draft JMA has been developed and shared with Ngāti Maru who are now working with the other Iwi authorities involved with the Waitara River Committee formation to consider the way forward.

Issues

8. There is a need for Council to make a decision about the proposal to extend the timeframe within which it is required to negotiate a JMA with Ngāti Maru.

Discussion

- 9. Progress is being made with development of both a Heads of Agreement relating to formation of the Waitara River Committee and drafting of a Ngāti Maru JMA. Given the significance of the Waitara River and these agreements it is important that the parties take time to negotiate agreements that will meet their mutual objectives. Moving to meet, what is effectively an artificial timeline creates a risk of this objective not being achieved.
- 10. It is proposed that Council agree to extend the deadline for reaching agreement with Ngāti Maru to 31 December 2024 to allow time for the issues involved to be comprehensively discussed between the parties.

Options

- 11. Option 1: extend the date by which a JMA must be agreed with Ngāti Maru to 31 December 2024.
 - This would allow Ngāti Maru the time required to seek out legal advice.
- 12. Option 2: decline the request to extend the deadline for agreement on the JMA. This would be counterproductive to the relationship between Council and Ngāti Maru.

Significance

13. A decision in accordance with the recommended approach is not considered significant. The decision being made relates to a procedural matter, which is provided for within relevant legislation and which is also supported by Ngati Maru.

Financial considerations—LTP/Annual Plan

Purpose

The purpose of this memorandum is to provide an update to the approach being taken
for the preparation of the 2024/2034 Long-Term Plan and to the financial approach as a
result of the 2023 general election and the announced policy positions of the new
government.

Recommendations

That the Taranaki Regional Council:

- a) <u>receives</u> and <u>notes</u> the update of the approach being taken to the preparation of the 2024/2034 Long-Term Plan and to the financial approach as a result of the 2023 general election.
- b) <u>notes</u> that this approach will be applied through to the adoption of the 2024/2034 Long-Term Plan Consultation Document and supporting documentation in February 2024.

Background

2. We are in the process of preparing the 2024/2034 Long-Term Plan (LTP). The work to date was based upon the legislative and policy framework in place. The 2023 general election has resulted in a change of government. The new government has signalled that a number of the policy positions and statutory provisions are either going to be amended or repealed.

Discussion

- 3. The LTP will need to be prepared to the statutory and policy positions in place. Accordingly, as the new government implements different policy positions and/or changes legislation, the approach taken to the preparation of the LTP will need to be adapted.
- 4. To date the LTP and associated budgets have been prepared on the basis of:

- the current programme of works
- proposed changes to current programme of works
- the statutory and policy changes adopted by the last government
- changes to statutory provisions and policy statements in place.
- 5. As the new government reaches new policy positions and changes legislation, we are updating the work programmes and budgets. The changes that have been implemented to date include reducing the new resources for the implementation of the National Policy Statement on Indigenous Biodiversity as the government has put the implementation "on hold" and reducing the resources required for implementation of the Natural and Built Environment Act 2023 and the Spatial Planning Act 2023 as the government has indicated that these Acts will be repealed before Christmas 2023.
- 6. The impact of these changes has been to reduce the work programmes and associated budgets. Allowing for the changes above, the current budget proposals for 2024/2034 are as follows:
